



**One Mountain Foundation  
Annual Membership Meeting  
Monday, November 15, 2010, 7:00 P.M.  
Fort Ritchie Community Center, Cascade, Maryland**

Chairman Bill Carter called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. The following Board members were present: Jamie Bowders, Bobbi Trostle, Dave Sanders, Jeff Coyle, Bill Coyle, Bev Coyle, Tom Rouzer, Nina Rouzer.

Absent Board members: Alice Humphrey, Jim Bittner and Kim Harbaugh.

Members and guests included: Heather Carter, Carrie Mummert, Frank Mummert and Herb Campbell.

In his opening remarks Bill Carter stated that the One Mountain Foundation had a successful year. He commented that the members should take pride in their accomplishments. The non-profits in the community raised over \$12,500 from Heritage Days and the community was made aware of the Help Hotline and the needs of the community. COPT used a COPT Care Days in which employees are allowed to wear blue jeans to work, and raised a total of \$1,710.00 for the Help Hotline. This was all made possible by the One Mountain Foundation.

The One Mountain Foundation also brought the community churches together with the help of the Cascade Sons of the American Legion.

Vice Chairman Jeff Coyle reported that there are plans to streamline events next year and to try to include a wine festival and also a Kansas City BBQ cook-off. Dave Sanders is bringing new ideas to the committee which will include a spaghetti dinner in January. A last chance drawing may be planned for March.

There was no Secretary's report.

Jamie Bowders reported that the OMF has taken in \$62,162.44 which came from donations, Mountaintop Heritage Days and various other events throughout the year. Expenses for the year were \$57,447.84, which included fundraising for the Help Hotline, Hope Now and Historical Entertainment.

John Miller resigned from his position as Chairman of the Heritage Development Committee. Bill stated that there is still a lot that can be accomplished through this committee due to the history of the area.

Alicia Miller resigned her position as Chairman of the Membership and Resource Committee. Bill reported that for 2010 year OMF had 79 adult members. So far for 2011 we have had 21 renewals and also 3 business sponsors which include H. E. Campbell and Sons, Sanders Market and McLaughlin's Heating.

Bill reported for public relations that there would always be a need to keep the website updated so that members and guests can be kept up to date on events. A calendar of events is in the planning stages to

make sure there are no conflicts of interest between OMF, churches, the Blue Ridge Summit Fire Hall, and other local groups.

Bill thanked Jamie and Nina for the work on the cookbooks. He also thanked Bev and Bill Coyle for the work on the calendars. Calendars should be ready for sale by December 11<sup>th</sup>.

Frank Mummert commented that Dick Wivell will be the new president of the Blue Ridge Sportsmen's Association and they look forward to hosting the dinner theater in April.

The Board made the following nominations for continuation of three years for board members: Jim Bittner, Jeff Coyle, Jamie Bowders and Kim Harbaugh. Nina motioned to nominate these members and Bobbi Trostle seconded the motion. Everyone was in favor by show of hands.

Vacancies on the board were as follows: Nina nominated Frank and Carrie Mummert to the open seats on the board. Jeff Coyle seconded the motion. Everyone was in favor by show of hands. Frank and Carrie accepted the nominations and are now new board members.

Herb Campbell was also nominated but declined because he is a new member and would like to get a feel for the organization.

Looking forward to 2011 there are many events planned. A bingo is planned for January 7<sup>th</sup> at the Blue Ridge Summit Plaza Restaurant. A spaghetti supper is planned for January 29<sup>th</sup> and a possible pancake breakfast is also being planned. The showing of the new DVD "Battle of Monterey Pass" may be planned for February, a last chance drawing in March, and an event with the Fallen Hero's Memorial.

Jeff Coyle thanked Bill for everything he has done this year which has been above and beyond his position.

The meeting ended at 7:45 pm.
